Mission

The mission of the Monroe Public Schools is to ensure that all students reach their full potential as innovative thinkers and responsible citizens through a challenging, inquiry-based curriculum delivered by skilled, dedicated, and engaging educators.



The School

Masuk High School is a four year comprehensive public high school offering curricular and co-curricular programs to approximately 1100 students in grades 9 through 12. Accredited through the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, the school offers a range of courses in college and career preparation. Community service is strongly encouraged and recognition is given at graduation for students who complete 100 hours.

Senior students are required to complete a senior Capstone Project which encompasses their career aspirations with experiential learning. The students present at the end of the year to a panel of faculty, mentors, and community representatives.

The Community

The town of Monroe is a residential community in suburban Fairfield County, CT. The 20,000 residents find abundant career and cultural opportunities nearby that place emphasis on preparation for higher education. Monroe is approximately an hour away from New York City.

The Staff

Masuk High School employs one principal, two assistant principals, over 100 certified teachers, six school counselors, two psychologists, eight Secondary Instructional Leaders, and an Athletic Director. A majority of faculty members hold advanced degrees.

Curriculum

Masuk High School offers an extensive curricular and co-curricular program to serve the range of student interests and abilities, including academics, vocational, fine arts, work experience, and special education opportunities. Courses are divided into three levels: AP/Honors, College Prep 1, and College Prep 2.

Masuk offers a total of 15 AP courses and 8 Early College Experience courses from the University of Connecticut. Most AP and ECE courses are predominantly offered junior and senior year and are considered the most rigorous courses in that discipline.

On the transcript, honors courses are designated, Advanced Placement with a "AP", and UCONN (ECE) courses with an UCT.

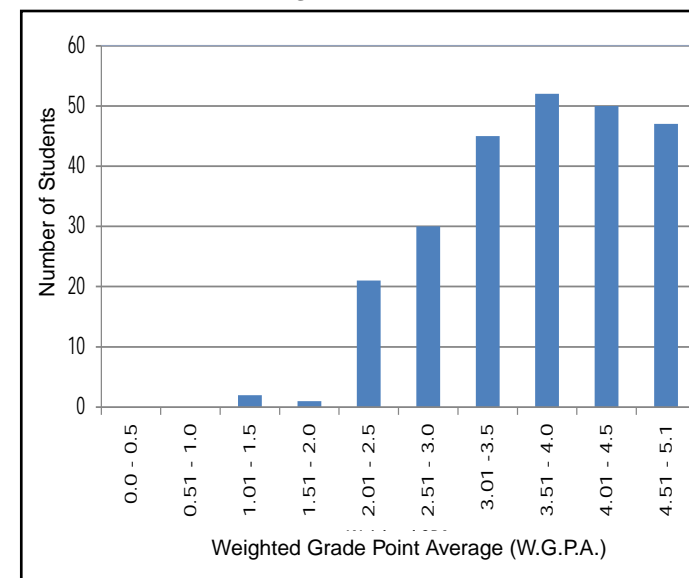
