

It is a combination of programs and opportunities afforded to all of our students. The purpose of the Student Success Plan is to create academic and personal goals, understand the need to support high school expectations, and explore the numerous opportunities to post secondary education and future careers.

Student Success Plans	A, P/S	Student Success Plans are created by every student in grades 6-8. This is achieved through online surveys and goal setting under the <u>Naviance Family Connection</u> program. Teachers and Counselors will be utilizing these plans to help students achieve their future potential.	
Elementary Transition Meetings	A,P/S	Elementary and Middle School principals, teacher and counselors meet to review the academic performance and social needs of students transitioning from grade 5 to grade 6. The information gathered is used to assist in determining course placement and class make-up for the following school year.	
Positive behavior System (PBS)	P/S	Jockey Hollow has a Positive Behavior System in place to educate students on social and behavioral expectations at school. "Lions Pride" is our system to remind students of expected behaviors at Jockey Hollow. There are positive "rewards" for students that demonstrate respect, responsibility, and safety.	
Advisory Groups	A,P/S,C	An advisor is assigned to small groups of 12-14 students. The students receive a lesson that focuses on such topics as internet safety, bullying, and transitioning to a new school to name a few.

Students are also given the opportunity to locate their lockers, walk their schedules and meet their teachers in a relatively informal setting.
